### **BIKE & BARGE CYCLING CRUISES**

What's NEW – Paris Highlights easy to moderate cycling, Moret-sur-Loing to Compiègne or return









See Paris from a totally different perspective, cruising and cycling through the city and surrounding villages and countryside which inspired artists, architects, kings and emperors. This **new** tour for 2015 crosses the city of Paris from picturesque Moret-sur-Loing to Compiègne with a free day mid-way to explore the city.

Cycling along the winding rivers Seine and Oise, we visit the chateau of Fontainebleau and Chantilly through the forests of Senart and Compiègne. We see scenes that inspired Van Gogh and Sisley and many other Impressionistes painters. We have a free day to explore Paris independently – you choose which sights of Paris to concentrate on be it the Eiffel Tower, one of the many museums, Notre Dame Cathedral or Sacré Coeur, the exclusive shops of the Champs Élysées or Bohemian Left Bank. Paris by night is floodlit and spectacular and we cruise through historic locks and swing bridges along a 19th Century canal.

Our cruise through the Ile de France and the city of Paris offers easy-to-moderate guided cycling, often on cycle paths and quiet roads. Well-maintained multi-geared bicycles with panniers are provided – comfortable, easy to ride and ideal for this route. There is a fascinating, varied guided cycling program with time to explore.

Our newly renovated barge on this route has 9 cabins (5 with twin split-level beds, 3 have a double bed and one cabin is for single use) for up to 17 guests. All cabins have en-suite shower/toilet and are simply furnished with two split level beds. No bunk beds on this barge. Bike & Barge cruises combine two popular ways of exploring Europe (cycling and river cruising), they allow partners of different abilities and interests to holiday together (trips are just as interesting for leisure cyclists OR cycling enthusiasts). Unpack just once and come 'home' each night to a wonderful meal cooked and served onboard and to a comfortable cabin to relax in.

# **BIKE & BARGING ON THE RIVERS SAAR & MOSELLE IN GERMANY**

A personal perspective from Sue Texler – the Outdoor Travel Reservations Manager







On a sunny day in September, my husband, Karl & I made our way to the delightful riverside towns of Kattenes/Alken, for our week's Bike & Barge tour on the Moselle & Saar Rivers in Germany. Arriving early, we met an obliging crew, dropped our luggage on the barge and wandered off to a pretty little Gasthof (waterside pub) for our first taste of Germany and the riverside life we would enjoy for the next week.

Our group comprised 11 Aussies, Canadians and Americans, in their 50's 60's & early 70's, all fairly fit but not necessarily the Tour de France. Some were repeat Bike & Barge fans and the rest of us soon would be.

Two of us chose E-Bikes, although we probably would have been OK on normal bikes for the most part. There is a certain E-Bike-delight however, in being able to keep up with the pack, sail up hills and still be in good shape at the end of the day. There were a few more serious bikers who wanted to do some extra km's and our guide was happy to oblige them, or let them head off self-guided, but for most of us the daily distances were just right. I had intentions of staying aboard on one day to experience the 'barging', but the cycle touring was too good to miss. Luckily we were collected on one afternoon, so we did get to enjoy cruising for a bit.

The crew were excellent and very welcoming. They had the barge and the tour running like clockwork and even though it was our guide's first tour in that area, he had obviously done lots of research and showed us the most delightful trails and landscapes. The food was plentiful and exactly right for hungry cyclists with the some amazing meals at the end of every day; everything from fresh local flavours, pastries and breads to dinner with a Moroccan theme and a gala dinner complete with Black Forest Torte. Of course the bar on board was well stocked also!

Our barge for the week came with an interesting maritime history and a friendliness lacking in some of the big river ships. That made it endearingly personal and still well appointed, with lovely sunlit areas to sit both in the lounge and up on deck. As we had delightful, sunny weather, we took maximum advantage of the on-deck table and chairs. Our cabin was small and cosy, with everything we needed, including comfy lower beds and an excellent shower which worked a treat after a day in the saddle.

Most of the tour for the week was on bike paths or bike lanes on the side of roads - our guide Bert was excellent at choosing the quieter routes. The bike paths were very popular with other cyclists, hikers and dog walkers and the group quickly developed a system of alerting calls. Of course villages represented a whole new challenge, but within a couple of days we had traffic, people and the savage danger of stone kerbs all sorted out.

The Moselle section of the tour was a plethora of immaculate, flower festooned villages, vine-clad hillsides, the lovely river, and perfectly manicured riverside parks and gardens. Everything was so green and it was amazing how steep and high upon the slopes the grapevines are planted. We were also impressed at the masses of grape bunches hanging heavily and almost ready for harvest.

The landscape was rich in history, especially Roman heritage, with hill-top forts, monasteries and castles dotting the skyline. Cochem had the most amazing views from our mooring especially when lit up at night. Early in the week we took a hike to the most breathtaking Castle Eltz, hidden in the forest and still used today. The tour through its perfectly preserved rooms was astonishing and you could imagine yourself as a knight or lady in times past. The riverside village of Zell with its fabled Black Cat was an absolute delight and we could have stayed there much longer. It was also one of our most picturesque mooring points.

Cycling was the best way to see things, and often you would come around another bend, to find a stunning river vista open out in front of you. It was also an easy way to get from village to village without having to tangle with the traffic on a busy motorway. Coming across a tiny chapel on a forest track or stopping for coffee in a small village certainly made us feel like we were discovering the local history and lifestyle. One day we had cycled up a vine-clad hill and then turned to traverse through the vines heavy with red and white grapes. The sun came out, lit up the entire landscape and the Moselle River winding through the valley below and it was a spectacular picture-postcard moment.

The Saar was an entirely different landscape, with more natural forests, tracks and steep wooded hills bracketing the winding river. This was a delightful contrast to the first part of the week. It is also home to some for the big-ticket items that were a must: Trier is one of the oldest German cities with a rich, well-preserved historic precinct, amazing Roman amphitheatre, Roman baths, spectacular churches and of course the spectacular Porta Nigra. Then there is Saarburg, with its amazing castle directly above our mooring point and fantastic winding streets, mill and waterwheels right through the centre of the town.

It was surprising how fast the week flew and before we knew it we were at our final celebration dinner and our tour was at an end. We bid a fond farewell to our bikes, barge and crew, hoping that before long we will be back to do it again... the only question is where?

#### Other comments about this tour:

Can't describe how wonderful the Bike/Barge was - we all agreed it was one of our best over 16 years of walking together as a group. The crew on board were so much fun and I would recommend that barge to anyone. From Albert who led the biking each day, to Ingeborg who cooked fabulous meals, to Marya who organised us and was a laugh a minute, to Ilya the captain who steered us without mishap, and to Yippy, their dear little dog. 


