Each of our hotel barges offers a unique cruising experience, boasting its own distinctive characteristics and personality. You can choose from a range of styles, from the charm of a traditional, cosy floating 'country house' adorned with varnished wood, brass, rich textures, and fabrics that reflect the region's beauty, to a spacious, contemporary design crafted with elegance and style in mind.

Our barges are categorised by cruise ratings, primarily based on cabin size. Our Ultra Deluxe cruises feature very spacious cabin suites, offering luxury comparable to high end hotels. Deluxe barges provide comfortable, slightly smaller cabins, while our First Class barges offer compact yet cosy cabins. The size of our vessels varies to accommodate the dimensions of the locks on different waterways, influencing the number of passengers each barge can carry. Our smallest hotel barge, Nymphea, in the Loire Valley, accommodates 6 guests, while our largest vessel, La Bella Vita, cruises the Venetian Lagoon and River Po with up to 20 passengers.

Regardless of the size or style you choose, you can rest assured that the level of service will remain impeccable throughout your stay, ensuring a memorable and delightful voyage.





How Their Stories Began

Most of the hotel barges in our fleet started life as cargo vessels carrying merchandise such as wine, timber or grain. Not only did these vessels serve different purposes before life as a hotel barge, but they also enjoy a variety of different hull styles. Today, these barges have been lovingly converted to offer the ultimate luxury boutique accommodation for small groups, whilst retaining their original character and heritage.

The 8-passenger Anjodi, a 1929 Luxe Motor barge, is the founding member of our fleet. She embarked on her first cruise with us along the UNESCO-listed Canal du Midi over 40 years ago. Her single-deck design allows her to navigate beneath the canal's famously low stone bridges effortlessly.

Our oldest vessel, the 8-passenger L'Art de Vivre, was originally designed to be towed by horse. Built in 1917 as an English barge, she carried munitions to the trenches of the Great War before transporting Cognac along the River Charente. Remarkably, she was once owned by the Great Grandson of Napoleon!


6-passenger Nymphea's Dutch Katwijker design, with its shallow draft, makes her the ideal vessel for navigating the beautiful sandy reaches of the River Cher in the Loire Valley. She is the only vessel to be able to cruise this magical waterway.

The 8-passenger Rosa, an old Dutch Klipper, was initially powered solely by sail and transported various cargoes on the offshore waterways of Holland and Belgium.

The 12-passenger Spirit of Scotland, although purpose-built over twenty years ago as a hotel barge, exudes a contemporary style that echoes the traditional steamers of the 19th and early 20th centuries. These steamers plied the lochs of Scotland as mail and passenger boats, offering a timeless charm that the Spirit of Scotland proudly upholds.









Whichever hotel barge you choose, you can rest assured that meticulous thought and care has gone into its interior design and furnishings. Each vessel is crafted to create a welcoming and relaxed atmosphere, evoking the charm and sophistication of a 'floating boutique hotel'.

Luncheon

Luncheon may be a delicious homemade soup and entrée, accompanied by a choice of local cheeses and wines, or perhaps a buffet of imaginative salads, pâtés, quiches, meat or fish platters — often served al fresco on the sunlit deck overlooking the countryside.

On your hotel barge moored beneath the stars, dinner is a gastronomic adventure and the finale to your day's journey of relaxation and discovery. You may be served Chèvre Chaud en Portefeuille, or Marinated Langoustines, followed by Filet d'Agneau au Basilic, Truite à la Chablisienne, or Magret de Canard au Vinaigre de Framboise — all complemented by fine wines. Then a selection of creamy and firm cheeses such as Chaource, Époisses or Morbier, before a delicious dessert, perhaps lle Flottante, Crème Brulée à la Vanille avec Tuiles aux Amandes, Tarte Tatin avec Caramel au Beurre Salé or Fondant au Chocolat. And afterwards, of course, relax with coffee and liqueurs in the company of your fellow passengers.





Burgundy

Burgundy boasts some of the world's finest wines with around 60,000 acres of sunlit vines and arguably the prettiest canals in France. These canals wind their way in smooth curves through the heart of renowned wine growing areas such as Chablis, Côte de Beaune and Côte de Nuits, sometimes rising steeply through a flight of locks that appear like staircases.

The Canal du Nivernais meanders along with the picturesque River Yonne, through a largely undiscovered region near the Morvan Hills, passing sleepy villages and Charolais cattle grazing in the lush pastures. This is the original home of hotel barging with its hand swung bridges and old logging sites, and where time seems to have stood still for centuries.

The landscape around Burgundy is one of rolling hills covered in forests of oak, maple and pine and where spring, summer and autumn each leave a unique signature. Medieval towns are surrounded by unspoilt countryside and the wonderful markets have stalls brimming with fresh local products cultivated on the fertile plains.

In Southern Burgundy, the smooth-flowing River Saône links the Canal de Bourgogne with the charming Canal du Centre which weaves its way through a landscape of vineyards producing renowned wines such as Santenay, Montrachet and Meursault.

Burgundy's gastronomic tradition is certainly rich and diverse and a sedate cruise on a hotel barge along one of its delightful waterways will allow you to indulge in good food and wine, two of the real pleasures in life.



St-Julien-sur-Dheune to Chalon-sur-Saône

Day 1 St-Julien-sur-Dheune

Guests are met in Paris and transferred by private chauffeured minibus to Finesse where a champagne welcome awaits them. Then there is time to wander along the towpath and admire the classic Burgundy scenery before dinner on board.

Day 2 St-Julien-sur-Dheune to St-Léger-sur-Dheune

This morning, we cruise along the Canal du Centre to St-Léger-sur-Dheune, descending a series of 11 locks along the way. After lunch on board, we visit the 14th century Château de Germolles, with its ducal chapel, medieval wall paintings and romantic gardens. Dinner on board.

Day 3 St-Léger-sur-Dheune to Remigny

This morning, we head to the ancient Roman city of Autun where we tour numerous antique monuments, including a 17,000 seat amphitheatre. Following lunch on board, we cruise past picturesque Burgundian villages to our mooring at Remigny. Dinner on board.

After breakfast, we drive through the Côte de Beaune vineyards to the town of Beaune. Our first stop will be a visit to the oldest winemakers in Burgundy, Maison Champy. Back on board, our last cruise takes us off the canal and on to the peaceful River Saône, and downstream to Chalon-sur-Saône — our final mooring. After lunch on board, enjoy free time to perhaps enjoy a walk to the elegant waterfront and imposing cathedral, before the Captain's Farewell Dinner on board.

Canal du Midi



Sallèles d'Aude to Trèbes

Day 1 Sallèles d'Aude to Le Somail

Guests are met in Narbonne and transferred by private chauffeured minibus to Enchanté where a champagne welcome and cruise to Le Somail awaits. Dinner on board.

Day 2 Le Somail to Roubia

This morning, we join a truffle hunt demonstration, following an expert truffle dog in search of the coveted 'black gold' beneath oak trees. After a truffle sampling, we go on to learn about the local olives and their oils during a tasting session. Afternoon cruise along the Grand Bief to the historical village of Roubia. Dinner on board.

Day 3 Roubia to Homps

Alsace & Lorraine

Once a vital thoroughfare connecting Paris with Alsace and Germany by means of the River Marne and River Rhine, the charming Canal de la Marne au Rhin has been transformed and modernised almost beyond recognition since it was completed over 150 years ago.

Today, the canal and the surrounding region of Alsace & Lorraine offers a captivating blend of French and German cultures, and picturesque scenery characterised by lush green landscapes and charming chocolate-box villages featuring quaint half-timbered houses and cobbled walkways. A gentle canal cruise whilst navigating through locks and bridges aboard hotel barge Panache adds to the journey's charm, revealing new vistas at every turn.

This unique region of France is also home to the city of Strasbourg, famed for its impressive Gothic cathedral, and the scenic Route des Vins d'Alsace stretching just over 100 miles. However, the most remarkable experience along the waterway may be the 450ft inclined plane of Saint-Lois Arzviller, also known as the Arzviller Boat Elevator, which replaced a series of 17 locks that previously would have taken more than a day to pass.

As well as its famed white wines, the cuisine of Alsace & Lorraine is characterised by a hearty blend of French and German culinary influences, featuring flavourful dishes like choucroute garnie, tarte flambée, and baeckeoffe. With more Michelin-starred restaurants here than in any other part of France, the region's cuisine is a true highlight.

Getting There is Half the Fun!

We know that your luxury barge cruise will be a memorable experience, and we hope your journey to your destination will be just as enjoyable! Whether you're flying into local airports, hop on high-speed trains, or driving across borders, each travel option has its advantages. Here's a practical guide to help you plan your journey to your hotel barge's meeting point, ensuring your adventure begins well before you step aboard.

Hotels

Designated meeting points for your chosen hotel barge are mostly within lobbies of luxury hotels that we have carefully selected for our clients' comfort and convenience. You may wish to stay in the same hotel before, or after your cruise if you are spending additional time in the region. Meeting times are predominantly on a Sunday afternoon, with return transfers on the following Saturday morning. With Burgundy cruises, return transfers are from a meeting point in central Paris such as the Hotel Westminster. Charter groups can choose their meeting point within a 30-minute drive of where the hotel barge is moored.

By Car

Driving to the hotel barge through rural countryside at your own pace in your own (or hired) car, can be a very enjoyable 'top and tail' to a cruise. For passengers travelling from the UK, there are many cross-channel routes, including the Eurotunnel, which takes only 35 minutes. Parking is often available at the meeting point hotel or at another convenient location. We can also provide clear directions, or a direct pick-up can often be arranged. Please note that parking is at your own risk and expense. You can also arrange your own private transfer from a railway station or airport, including those just outside the French borders. Driving times to the barges are reasonable, ranging from around one hour from Toulouse for a Canal du Midi barge to four hours from Geneva for one of our Burgundy barges.



By Train

Rail services in Europe, and particularly in France, are excellent. The high-speed TGV trains operate from Paris to all regions and link to the Eurostar trains from London. Transfers from local stations to the meeting point is usually very easy, or a direct hotel barge pick up can often be arranged from the platform. In addition, there are reliable rail services into France from cities in neighbouring countries, such as Barcelona on the northeast coast of Spain, and Zurich in central Switzerland which give access to our Canal du Midi, and Alsace & Lorraine cruising regions.

By Plane

As well as the major hubs such as Paris, London, Amsterdam, Frankfurt, and Brussels, there are many well-served regional airports near our cruise routes such as Lyon, Montpellier, Carcassonne, Toulouse, Strasbourg, Venice, Verona, and Inverness. Flying to or from airports in adjoining countries such as Barcelona, Zurich or Geneva is also an attractive option if you wish to spend some time in another destination before or after your barge cruise.
